## GOVERNOR'S SUMMER RESIDENCE TOURS

Built in 1901 for the Cudahy family of Chicago and designed by architect Frederick Perkins, this shingle style arts and crafts cottage was built by Mackinac Island's own Irish immigrant/craftsman Patrick Doud. It now serves as the summer residence of the governor of Michigan and has been home to nine Michigan governors. Tours are given from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. each Wednesday from June 6 through August 24. Admission is free.



## HORSEBACK RIDING

Saddle horses are available for guided and unguided trail riding from Cindy's Riding Stables and Jack's Livery. Price is \$30 per hour.



## BUTTERFLY EXHIBIT

More than 800 live butterflies from around the world fly freely in the Mackinac Island Butterfly House's tropical garden – just a few blocks down from downtown behind Saint Anne Church. Butterfly House is open from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Adult admission is \$7, children 6-12 are \$4, and children 5 and under are free.



## FORT MACKINAC

Constructed by British soldiers during the American Revolution, Fort Mackinac served as a sentinel in the Straits of Mackinac for 115 years. Today the original restored fort is a National Historic Landmark. Begin your tour with the audio visual presentation, "Heritage of Mackinac," in the Post Commissary. Then trace the footsteps of British and American troops as you explore historic buildings, enjoy the exhibits and watch lively demonstrations. Tours are given from 9:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. from June 9 to August 25. Full dinner service is available at the Fort Mackinac Tea Room restaurant. Adult admission is \$10, children 6-17 are \$6, and children 5 and under are free.



## THE JEWEL GOLF COURSE

Across the street from Grand Hotel Mackinac Island lies the scenic Jewel golf course. The course is comprised of the Grand nine and the Woods nine, set in the interior of Mackinac Island.

The Grand nine was built in 1901 and redesigned in 1987. The Woods nine was added in 1994, designed by Jerry Matthews.

Greens fees for 9 holes cost \$49 for hotel guests; \$59 for non-guests. 18 holes cost \$85 for hotel guests; \$115 for non-guests. Gas-powered carts and pull carts are included. Rentals are also available.



## CARRIAGE TOURS

Horse-drawn carriage tours of the island are available through Gough's Livery and Mackinac Island Carriage Tours. Jack's Livery offers a "Drive Your Own Buggy" service. Contact these vendors for their individual prices.
