Vote No on Proposal 06-5: This Initiative Mandates School Funding Levels.

The proposal requires the state to provide annual funding increases equal to the rate of inflation for public schools, intermediate school districts, community colleges and higher education (includes state universities and financial aid/grant programs).

While the MBA is vitally concerned with quality education, it is inherently bad public policy to remove legislative discretion for educational funding for local school districts.
